Must possess analytic skills, demonstrate the potential for peer-reviewed publications and grant funding, as well as classroom teaching experience in the field of sport management, outdoor education, and/or public health active living. This candidate will teach courses in sport and leisure service administration and active living in both the graduate and undergraduate programs.

#### **Qualifications:**

Earned Doctorate in Sport Management, Health and Productivity Management, or related field. The candidate will present an established record of leadership in active living productivity management. The candidate must demonstrate the knowledge and personal skills necessary to initiate and maintain public awareness and educational activities related to active living initiatives. The candidate must demonstrate an ability to interact with and provide leadership to various constituencies (faculty, staff and greater Chattanooga community). The ideal candidate will promote active living by leading a healthy and active lifestyle.
